

COVID-19 UPDATE FROM NORTH ELBA SUPERVISOR JAY RAND

April 26, 2020

Dear Citizens of North Elba,

It was great to see some sunshine yesterday if even for a day. Personally, I took advantage of it and got some overdue yard cleanup done. I am sure many of you did the same. Of course, snow is predicted again this week or so I'm told!

In any case, since my April 18th report a couple of items need to be updated as follows:

Weather permitting the plan is to **open Craig Wood Golf Course on May 9**, as golf courses around the State will be allowed to reopen after a revision to Governor Cuomo's NY PAUSE EXECUTIVE ORDER. Strict guidelines in reference to social distancing must be maintained (6 feet at all times.) The Clubhouse will not be open for any purpose, carts are not permitted with the exception of a personal pull cart, cups to be arranged so no one has to reach into the hole, no sand trap rakes will be provided, etc.

Yes, it is true - full season passes are only **\$199.00!** Call 518-523-9516 for additional information or to purchase a pass.

The **Craig Wood Driving Range** is now open under strict social distancing rules. A heads up – you must bring your own bag or basket to receive your balls in.

NYS has removed the temporary suspension on the use of **boat launches** for recreation. Access to boat launches is allowed if strict adherence to the CDC/New York State Department of Health guidelines for preventing the spread COVID-19 are followed.

On April 21, The Regional Office of Sustainable Tourism (ROOST) hosted up a phone conference to discuss planning ideas on how to proceed when the governor begins to lift the NY Pause Order. Over 200 people, including several counties were included in the discussion, which focused on a phased or teared approach to reopening the economy.
